What is laser therapy?

A drug-free, surgery-free, non-invasive, pain free treatment in which low-intensity laser light is applied to the body to treat painful & debilitating conditions for pets.



How does laser therapy work?

Infrared light penetrates deep into tissue to create a photo-chemical reaction that increases production of ATP, a building block substance that cells use to repair themselves. Water, oxygen and nutrients are brought to the damaged area to promote healing. This happens through a process called Photobiomodulation.
